

Outline of higher education reforms in Croatia

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Universities landscape

- 186,240 students
- Three "types" of universities in Croatia
 - UNI Zagreb around 76,000 students and over 30 constituents
 - 3 mid-sized universities (Rijeka, Osijek, Split)
 - 3 integrated universities (Dubrovnik, Zadar, Pula)
 - 80% of students study at universities
- Overall more than 130 institutions (public and private)



Responsible/managing stakeholders

- Higher Education Institutions
 - Universities, faculties, academies, polytechnics, schools of professional higher education,
 - Act on Scientific Activity and Higher Education (2003)
 - university autonomy entrance quotas, tuition fees and tuition fees remissions, lump-sum decisions (within budgetary limits), strategies and priorities of development
 - high level of responsibility

Responsible/managing stakeholders (2)

- MSES Directorate for Higher Education
 - Higher Education Development Department
 - policy recommendations and developments, stocktaking reports,
 EU funds preparation
 - Higher Education Management Department
 - financial matters, study programmes, statistics on HE
 - Student Standard Department
 - state scholarships, students with disabilities, students ombudsman

Responsible/managing stakeholders (3)

- Directorate for International Cooperation and European Integration
 - multilateral cooperation, mobility issues
- Directorate for Science
- Directorate for Joint Programmes
 - Validation of foreign qualifications for enrolling at a university
 - Human Rights Program and Equality Between Sexes Program
- Directorate for National Minorities
 - Information campaigns, Roma students

Responsible/managing stakeholders (4)

- Agency for Science and Higher Education
 - professional and administrative support in the procedures of approving of new programmes and evaluating QA systems
 - National ENIC/NARIC office
- Agency for Mobility and EU Programmes
 - Mobility initiatives, EU LLP, Joint-programmes
- Agency for Vocational Education and Training and Adult Education
 - Currently being formed

Recent legislation reforms

- The Act on Academic and Professional Titles and Academic Degree (2007)
 - Overarching system of titles for Bologna graduates
- Act on Student Council and Other Student Organizations (2007)
 - Student Ombudsman
- Act on Quality Assurance in Science and Higher Education (2009)
- National Guidelines for the Issuance of the Diploma Supplement Document (2008)
 - all students receive DS free of charge in the EU/CoE/UNESCO format



Forthcoming legislation and policy initiatives

- Universities Act
 - Integration of universities
 - Three-year funding agreements between government and universities (agreement will include both basic and performancebased budget; input and output factors taken into account)
- Further development of IT and statistics system on national level (NISVOZ)
- Reform of tuition fees and overall coverage of costs of studying, including student support
- IPA and ESF funds
